There are many actions you could take. Perhaps you can discuss it as a household (a great learning exercise!) and make your choices.

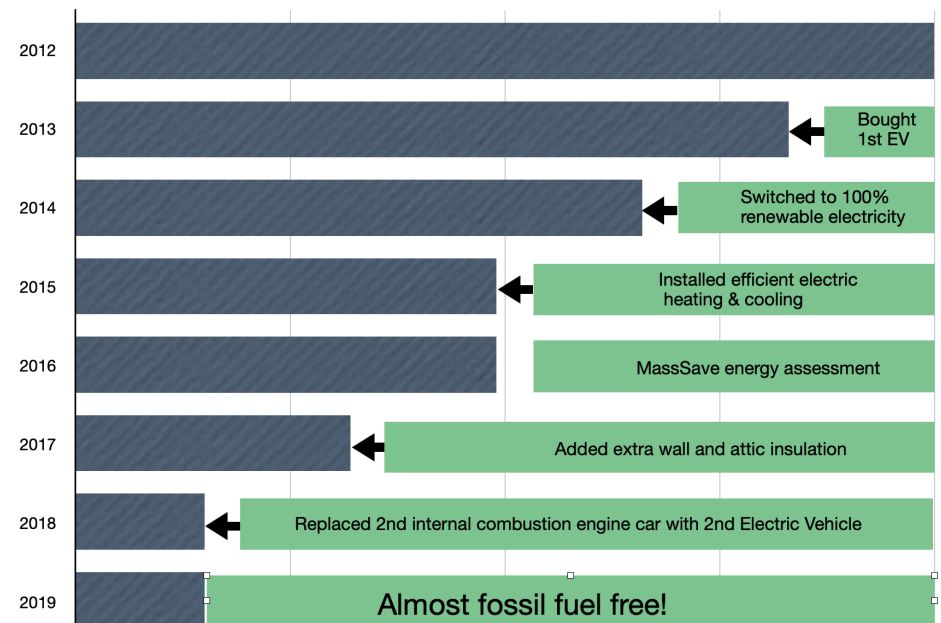
-

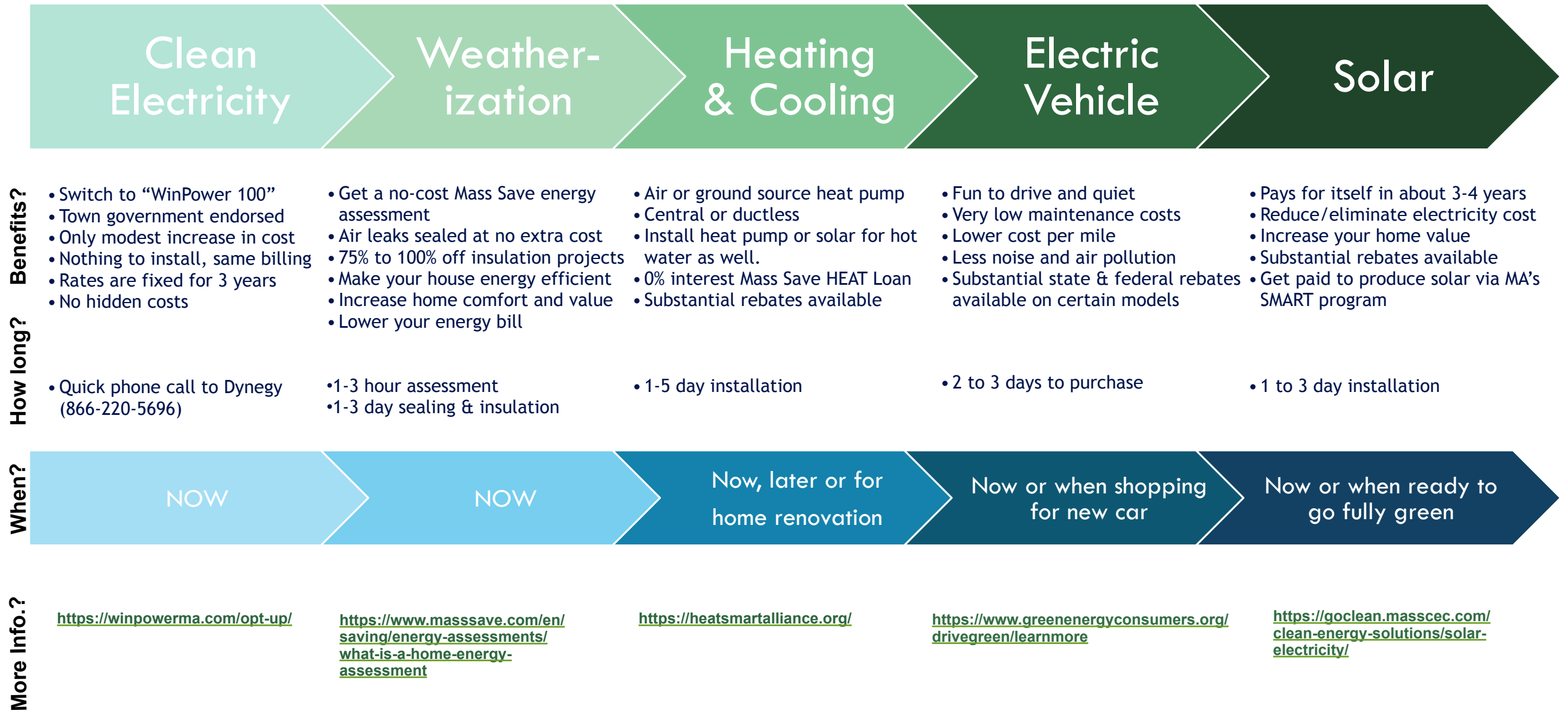
